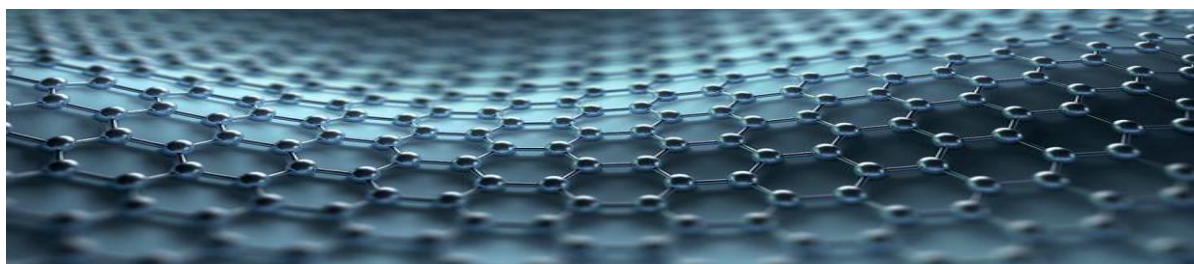




***The Second AACG Carbon Symposium

Abstracts should be 1–3 pages in length, including the authors' names, institution, address, and email. The deadline for abstract submission is **March 15, 2026**. Abstracts should be submitted via the website [xxxx].

This abstract template is intended to provide a common format that will require minimal reformatting when preparing the *Book of Abstracts*. Therefore, we kindly ask that abstracts be submitted as attachments in **Rich Text Format (RTF)** or **MS Word** format.

Please note that the corresponding author identified in the abstract will be entered into our database for all email correspondence. **Underline the name of the corresponding author.** Only the corresponding author should send and receive emails.

Make sure that your abstract is informative to ensure proper session placement and to attract the interest of your colleagues. Figures and tables may be included to convey essential information. References should be included only if necessary and placed at the end of the abstract.

Your abstract must not exceed **one page**. The text should be written in **Times New Roman**, 12 pt font size, single line spacing, and justified to both the left and right margins. Paragraph spacing should be **0 pt before and 10 pt after**.

Please note that the margins should be **25 mm** on all sides (top, bottom, left, and right), with a typed area not exceeding **16 cm × 25 cm**, including any tables, figures, and references. The abstract title should be written in **bold letters**.
